GUIDELINES for the Role of the Resource Teacher

The Role of the Resource Teacher could potentially involve the following...

Coordinate

-Transition to new environments (*coordinate/collaborate depending on the school environment)

-Resource team meetings

-Assist teachers in the IEP process and monitor progress

-Life/social skills activities (*where applicable)

-Professional development for integration aids

-Recommendations of technical supports (*high school level)

-Referral process and monitoring (gathering documentation, collection of information)

Maintain/Contribute

-Liaison with outside resources (*as needed)

-Daily on the spot problem solving

-Consult confidential school files(*elementary)

-Remain current with special needs policies

Collaborate

-Liaison with parents (*with classroom teacher, principal)

-Set up Ad. Hoc meetings

-Co-teaching (*where applicable)

-Work directly with some school board professionals (SLP, Psycho-Educator etc.)

-Direct in class support

-Support teachers with adapted and modified programs

-Participate in professional development/network meetings

-Coordinate site based special needs committee

-Scheduling of aids and support workers in school (*depending on school with principal)

-Inform teachers of accommodations for exams/classes (*high school)

Teaching and Planning

-Teach (various group sizes and potentially one-on-one)

-Planning/developing interventions

-Remediation

-(Potentially) Early Intervention (*elementary)

-Conduct academic assessments (EI, DRA, Key Math, Brigance, etc.) (* at the high school level these are done in coordination with the psycho-educator and psychologist)
